Unsightly Property – Presently our Borden-Carleton Police Services are issuing **Clean Up Notices** for unsightly premises.

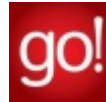
Dangerous, Hazardous, and Unsightly Premises Bylaw #14A

Paragraph 3.16 – “Unsightly Premises” means any property or part of it which is characterized by visual evidence of a lack of general maintenance and upkeep by the accumulation on the premises. See bylaw for specifics.
